Application Information and Deadlines

This information is supplied so you understand the application process. You should never indicate a student's chances of admission, or when they should apply. Questions on applications should be directed to <u>admissions@nd.edu</u>.

Submitting an application

Notre Dame accepts the <u>Common Application</u>, the <u>Coalition Application</u>, and the <u>QuestBridge Application</u>. A completed application contains:

- The Notre Dame Writing Supplement via the Common Application or Coalition Application
- The Notre Dame Supplement (QuestBridge only)
- Self-reported or official results of your ACT or SAT assessment scores if not applying test optional
- Official high school transcripts or record of academic achievement in secondary school
- A letter of evaluation from a high school teacher in a core academic subject area who knows you well
- Counselor evaluation (recommended, not required)
- A non-refundable application fee of \$75
- Students will be notified when their application is complete or if any items are missing from their application

Application Deadlines

Restrictive Early Action

- Deadline: November 1
- Notification: Mid-December
- A student applying Restrictive Early Action to Notre Dame may apply to other colleges with Early Action programs, but may
 not apply to any other college or university in their binding Early Decision process. Students do not indicate a first-choice preference
 by applying early and still may wait until May 1 to indicate their decision to attend.

Regular Decision

- Deadline: January 1
- Notification: By the first week of April

Possible Admissions Decisions

Restrictive Early Action

- Admission to the University
- Denial of Admission to the University
- Deferral of Decision until Regular Decision

Admitted students have until the May 1 deadline to decide whether they would like confirm their attendance at the University. If a student is denied admissions in Early Action, the process ends and he or she cannot apply later during Regular Decision. If a student is deferred, the Admissions Committee has decided to review the application further in the Regular Decision process, and the application "rolls over" to Regular Decision.

Regular Decision

- Admission to the University
- Denial of Admission to the University
- Waiting List

Students who are waitlisted will receive a final admission decision by the end of June. The Admissions Committee waitlists students who would be viable candidates for admission should additional room become available in the First Year class.
