Completing the Notre Dame financial aid application process will ensure consideration for all sources of need-based assistance. Recognizing that every family's situation is unique, the Office of Financial Aid is committed to a thorough and individual review of each application for financial assistance. Our review considers many factors including size of household, number in college, assets and special circumstances.

To give you a sense of how Notre Dame used its own resources to assist first-year students in the fall of 2022, the chart below reflects the number of students by parent income who received need-based scholarship. By providing the median (amount that falls in the middle) and the range we hope you are able to get an idea of the need-based scholarship commitment the University has made and how families with different resources are financing their cost.
